From bookmarks to coasters, students will explore the versatility of plastic canvas while building fine motor skills, patience, and artistic expression. By the end of the course, students will have a few handmade items and the confidence to continue stitching independently.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND APPROXIMATE TARGET DATES:

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Identify and correctly use basic tools and materials for plastic canvas cross stitching.
- Execute foundational cross stitching techniques with proper tension and direction.
- Read and interpret beginner to intermediate cross stitch charts and patterns.
- Design simple cross stitch patterns using graph paper.

STUDENT ASSESSMENT - what will be used to evaluate student progress and/or end of semester pass/fail status?
