Master the ancient and expressive technique of sgraffito, where you decorate surfaces by carving through colored slips or underglazes to reveal the clay beneath. Ayla Batton Wyman will teach the history of the art form, how to use different carving tools, and essential tips for managing the clay's dryness for optimal results. You will learn key design principles, proper application of slips versus underglazes, and final glazing techniques to transform your vision into finished pieces.

We will begin by sharpening your understanding of color theory and composition. Then, you'll level up by exploring how to translate your personal interests and style into paint. Projects will cover various genres—including landscape, abstract, portrait, and still life—while also leaving room for you to follow your own creative quest. The class also incorporates sketching (on paper and digitally) and critical discussions of historical and contemporary painting to help you develop your voice as an artist.
