Eli Zilke began glassblowing at the age of 12 as a student in the Water Street Glassworks Fired Up! after-school program. He eventually became a studio tech and teaching assistant under Jerry Catania, founder of Water Street Glassworks. Eli assumed the role of Studio Manager/Support and primary Glassblowing Instructor in 2018.

Gina Edwards has been working as a glass artist for over 20 years, and has been a Fused Glass and Beadmaking instructor at Water Street Glassworks for 16 years.

COURSE DESCRIPTION (OVERVIEW):

Have you wanted to experience the fire arts but aren't sure what to try first? This studio "sampler" workshop will provide you with the opportunity to try your hand at several glass projects in three studios: Glassblowing, Fusing and Beads.

You will rotate through the studios and work with our knowledgeable instructors as they guide you to create a piece in each medium. Expect to create:

- Week 1 Glassblowing Studio Intro to Glassblowing (2 glassblown pieces)
- Week 2 Fusing Studio Fundamentals of Fusing (2 fused glass pieces coaster & plate)
- Week 3 Bead Studio Beginning Beadmaking (Several flameworked beads)
- Week 4 Glassblowing Studio Spincasting (1 spincasting piece)

SYLLABUS/OUTLINE: WEEKLY BREAKDOWN OF PROJECT-BASED LEARNING LAB ACTIVITIES

Describe activities that will reinforce the lesson. Include any work and time to be required outside of class:

Week 1 - Glassblowing Studio - Safety exercises, lecture on glass properties, learn tool use, teamwork and gathering exercises. Projects teaching tool use are: the paperweight and caterpillar exercise.

Week 2 - Fusing Studio - Learn to cut and layer glass to create masterpiece that will be fired in the kiln for completion.

Week 3 - Bead Studio - Safety precautions, lecture on glass properties, learn tool use, beadmaking terminology and annealing process. Beadmaking demonstration followed by student torch time for practicing basic shaping techniques, including dots, grooves and stringers. Removing beads from mandrels

Week 4 - Glassblowing Studio - Apply the principle of centrifugal force to ladle cast glass to get one-of-a-kind, beautiful bowls. Form bowl shapes in sand and press in patterns to create "one-use" molds. Pour in the glass and "spin" for a work of art.
