COURSE DESCRIPTION (OVERVIEW): Students will have the opportunity to write a premium resume using organization tools. Students will also learn techniques for how to craft a resume that will stick out to potential employers. Students will also be provided with materials and technology to craft a cover letter and references list, plus a guide to building their portfolio for interview ventures.

SYLLABUS/OUTLINE: WEEKLY BREAKDOWN OF PROJECT-BASED LEARNING LAB ACTIVITIES This class is broken down into two 8 hours sessions. The first session will include gathering data for skill set, job experience, training in using language to maximize readabilty and targeting marketable employee features that will help students compete in the job market. In addition to building a resume rough draft, students will be generating their page of references and cover letters. The second session will be taking the rough draft from the first session and compiling it into a resume template, refining data, formatting, and printing their

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND APPROXIMATE TARGET DATES:

Students need to attend the first class and be able to reflect on their skills. During class, we will discuss what types of skills and features are needed by employers. I'll be looking for students to think about and be able to communicate what they offer in terms of their marketable qualities and what makes them stand out from other candidates.
