COURSE DESCRIPTION (OVERVIEW): A FUN ASL course taught by a Deaf person, this online class follows ASL 101. ASL 201 will continue to cover ASL vocabulary and grammar. Weekly instructional videos will be provided in Canvas where students will watch, learn, practice, and complete the accompanying assignments. Students will also have the opportunity to record themselves signing!

There are 12 instructional videos that will each require about 1.5 to 2 hours to complete, including the assignments and practice time. Here are the instructions that I include in my Canvas course for my students: Every week, you will watch a video that pairs with your lesson sheet. (Be sure to print out the lesson sheet before you watch the video, so you can answer questions as you watch along!) Your lesson sheets can be found inside the Modules on Canvas. Each week, you will open a Module and find a Lesson Sheet, Video, and Answer Key to your lesson sheet. Try not to use the Answer Key unless you need to or wait until after you have completed your lesson sheet. After you have completed your lesson sheet, please take a picture of your lesson sheet to upload to Canvas, under Assignments. You will also get to record yourself signing and then you can upload your video to Canvas. This will be fun! 😊 To record yourself signing, please go to Studio on Canvas, click on the Record option and select Webcam capture. Then you can easily upload your video in Assignments on Canvas.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND APPROXIMATE TARGET DATES:

Steps to check for student understanding, along with dates or # of weeks into class:

Students need to submit their weekly assignments on Canvas to receive credit. For their recorded videos, students will be given 2-3 weeks for each lesson to complete and turn in for credit.

1) Student agrees to attend at least 80% of class sessions/lessons offered.

Attendance

is kept online and tracked by Partnership staff. Failure to meet 80% or be on track

to meet 80% may result in program discontinuation.

2) The Partnership Student Assessment or Performance Form is filled out by the teacher and turned in to Partnership staff. The link to this form is found on the web

page for this class. Failing marks for lack of participation, behavior issues, practice

time, etc. may result in program discontinuation.

Class-specific assessment: discuss and include the form or a link to the form that you use.

To complete ASL 201, students will need to attend (log into Canvas) at least once weekly to view the videos and to print, complete and upload their assignments.

Once students have submitted their assignments, I will comment on their work and interact with them through comments on Canvas.
