Blacksmithing Safety Notice

Interested in the blacksmithing — even just to observe?

Safety is important to all of us. Wear clothing made from natural fibers, like cotton, wool, leather, etc. Due to their inherent flammability, manufactured fabrics like nylon, spandex, polyester, etc. can significantly increase the tissue damage caused by a burn if something hot lands on it.

Attire:

- Natural Fiber clothes.
- No cuffs.

- No Jewelry
- No shorts, period.
- No open-toed shoes or shoes with holes in them.
- No sandals or crocs.
- Long sleeves preferred.
- If your hair is longer than 6 inches, please bring a secure way of tying it back.
- Tong on Glove hand is recommended for gas forges, but optional.

We will provide

- Personal eye protection: safety glasses or goggles.
- Personal hearing protection: ear plugs or sound reducing head gear.

Students should provide

- Personal Water
- Personal Snacks

COURSE DESCRIPTION (OVERVIEW):

Our Philosophy

At Wolf Prairie Historic Arts, LLC we concentrate on developing the fundamental skills of a blacksmith through an instructor led age and skill level appropriate project-based approach. Each successive project is built on to the previous ones to either improve an existing skill or

introduce a new one, with the goal of providing a foundation for a lifetime of blacksmithing enjoyment.

The Seven Fundamental Skills of the blacksmith, we teach are:

- 1) **Drawing out**: Lengthening and thinning a piece of metal by hammering it out.
- 2) **Upsetting**: Shortening and thickening a piece of metal by hammering one end.
- 3) **Punching**: Creating holes in the metal, usually while it is hot.
- 4) **Bending**: Shaping the metal into different forms, sometimes over the horn of the anvil or with specialized tools.
- 5) Splitting (or Cutting): Using a chisel to cut a bar, either to length or lengthwise.
- 6) **Twisting:** Introducing a twist into a bar for decorative or functional purposes.
- 7) **Forge welding:** Bonding two pieces of metal together by heating them to a welding temperature and striking them with a hammer.

Our Courses

For the 2026 Spring Semester we are offering the following courses:

1) Beginning Blacksmithing: For ages 10 & up, or in 5th grade or higher. For younger students/siblings please contact the instructor.

An introductory course designed using lighter materials where the child is given more time to complete the projects as an introduction to blacksmithing. For many students these projects will take more than 1 class to complete. The Parent/Guardian etc., may work with the child or if space is available complete the project with the parent(s) paying a \$20 per class materials fee.

2) Blacksmithing Fundamentals for ages 12 & up.

This is our flagship course and concentrates on developing the skills taught in the globally recognized curriculum through ABANA (Artist Blacksmith Association of North America). However, the focus is not on completing a checklist of requirements but on developing an understanding of the how and why as a foundation for a lifetime of blacksmithing enjoyment.

3) Independent Study (Special Projects). Ages 12 & up and requires previous experience and instructor approval.

This course concentrates on completing a special project of the students' choosing and requires the student to provide the materials. As an example, a student might want to make a reenactors civil war set up with tripod, cooking utensils and table supports, Gun supports, Flag holders, etc. Usually, this class is done in longer classes that meet less frequently; however it still requires a minimum of 16 hours of instruction.

4) Special Needs, requires instructor approval

Working one on one we offer ADA compliant blacksmithing instruction for those with special needs. This specialized instruction provides a unique experience for the student with instructor/parent helping as needed. We have worked with students ranging from those with limited vision to those with completely impaired. We have worked with those

who are confined to wheelchairs. Because this is extremely instructor intensive, we have limited availability. Please contact Henry Davis for more details, and availability.

SYLLABUS/OUTLINE: WEEKLY BREAKDOWN OF PROJECT-BASED LEARNING LAB ACTIVITIES

Weekly breakdown of instruction: There will be eight two-hour sessions. Classes will involve discussion of shop safety, forging demonstration(s) by the instructor, and student creation of hand forged items. Frequent water breaks are suggested. A 10 min break may be taken halfway through the class for drinks and snacks.

Representative schedule and projects:

Please Note: This varies from class to class, or even within the students in a specific class depending on the skill level of the individual student(s).

Week 1: Discuss shop safety. Practice "drawing a taper" by forging "kabob skewers".

Week 2: Review shop safety. Forge one or more square nails and turn one into a key fob.

Week 3: Forge an "S" hook from square stock, add decorative twist and end finial.

Week 4: Forge twisted candle holder. (also known as a "courting candle")

Week 5: Forge "letter opener" with handle twist and hook final decorative elements.

Week 6: Forge a "coat hook" with a leaf motif decorative element.

Week 7: Begin forging and fabricating

an "Iron Puzzle".

Week 8: Finish the "Iron Puzzle".

Schedule and projects will be adjusted depending on student skills and needs.

Steps to check for student understanding, along with dates or # of weeks into class:
